In this paper we are building a web-based portal to view, buy and sell clothing, footwear, accessories etc... We have provided means to register and later login with unique user name and password to the web portal for both admin called admin login and for the client/customer called user login. The main objective of this application is to bring all items-clothing, footwear, watches and other accessories of different vendors under one roof and make it available to the public through World Wide Web hosting. All the operations are automated –billing, registration and acknowledgement, proper report generation, mail and tweets. In this paper we practically explain both server side scripting and client side scripting and the languages used in the above. - The admin has the rights/ powers to add or remove any new/ old commodity; increase or decrease the price; block a commodity which is out of stock or controversial
- Shows the available stock in numbers and is decremented after each purchase automatically
- An automated feedback form is generated after the customer receives the goods or commodity

II. SERVER-SIDE SCRIPTING

Server-side scripting is a technique used in web development which involves employing scripts on a web server which produce a response customised for each clients request to the website, it is also called back-end web development. The back-end comprises of

 - 4. AJAX

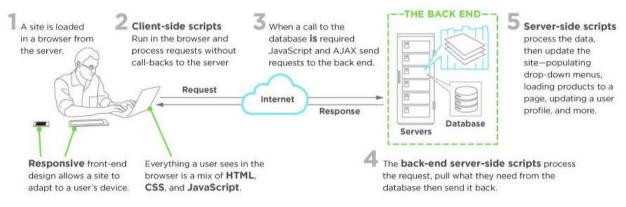


Figure 1 shows block diagram of front-end development

- We have also provided provision for admin login to update the website by the vendor or any third party, software/web maintenance firm to add/ delete products; information and pricing.

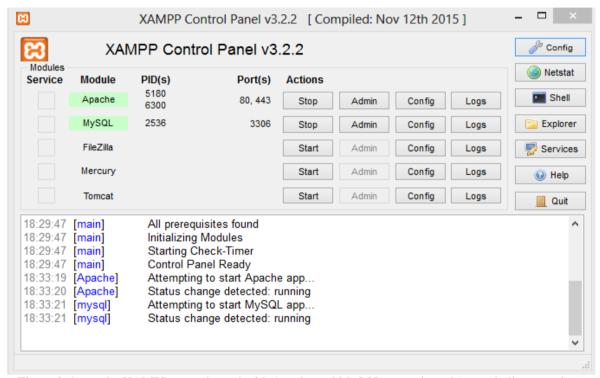


Figure 2 shows the XAMPP control panel with Apache and MySQL are activated (green indicates active)

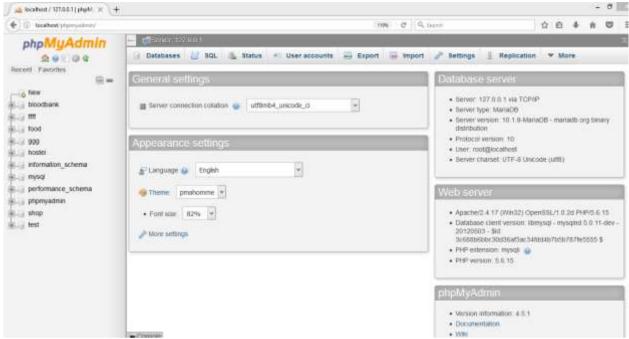


Figure 3 shows the phpMyaAdmin screen

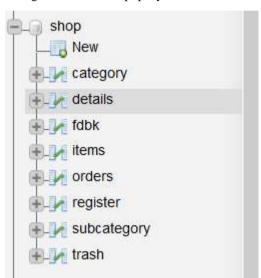


Figure 4 shows the database shop and its tables

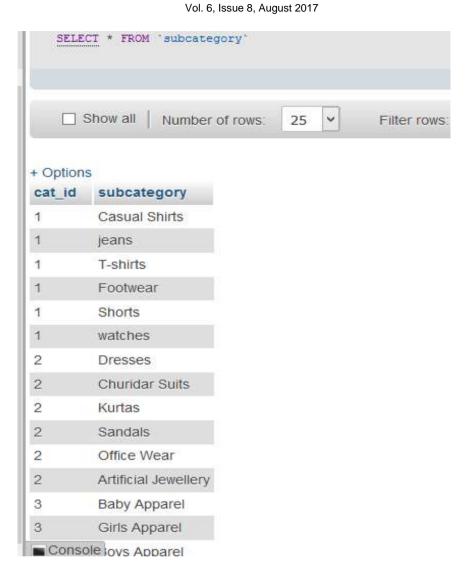


Figure 6 shows the table 'subcategory'

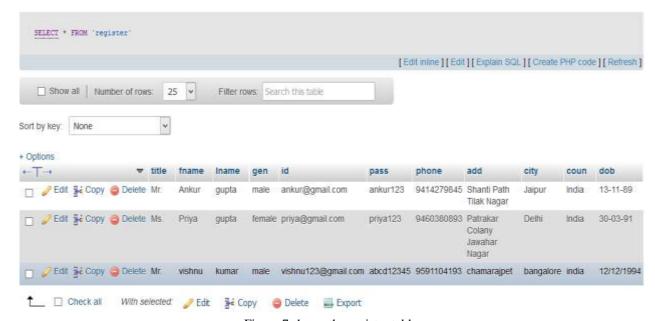


Figure 7 shows the register table

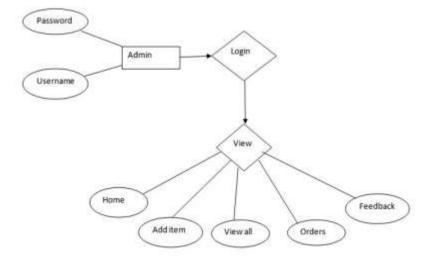


Figure 12 shows the ER diagram for the user

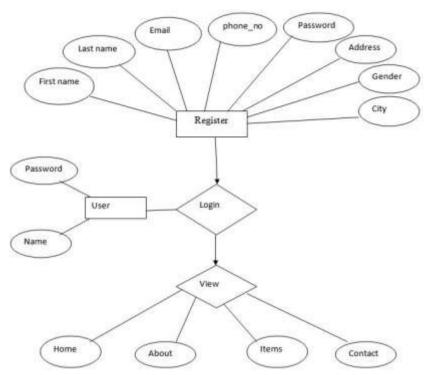


Figure 13 shows the ER diagram for the admin
